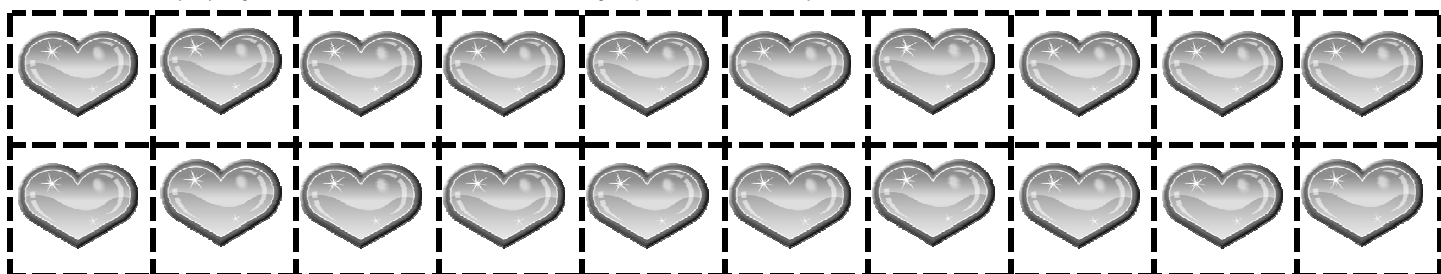


# Valentine's Day Hundred Chart Puzzle (A)

# Valentine's Day Hundred Chart Puzzle (A)

*Directions: Read each instruction below to your students. They place their cut out hearts on the hundred chart according to the clues. This puzzle makes the letter "I" and a heart.*

- 1. Place a heart on the number that is one less than 40.*
- 2. Place a heart on the number that is equal to 2 plus 3.*
- 3. Place a heart on the number that is ten more than 32.*
- 4. Place a heart on the number that is equal to two tens.*
- 5. Place a heart on the number that is two greater than 33.*
- 6. Place a heart on the number that has a 2 in the tens place and a 2 in the ones place.*
- 7. Place two hearts on the two numbers that come just before 10.*
- 8. Place a heart on the number that is four less than six.*
- 9. Place a heart on the number after 47.*
- 10. Place a heart on the number that is up and to the left of 35 on the hundred chart.*
- 11. Place a heart on the number that is three tens.*
- 12. Place a heart on the number that is between 51 and 53.*
- 13. Place a heart on the number that finishes this pattern: 2, 4, 6, 8, 10, \_\_\_\_.*
- 14. Place a heart on the number that finishes this pattern: 10, 9, 8, 7, \_\_\_\_.*
- 15. Place a heart on the number that is 10 more than 36.*
- 16. Place a heart on the number that comes after 56.*
- 17. Place a heart on the number that has a 7 in the ones place and a one in the tens place.*
- 18. Place a heart on the number that is five greater than 9.*
- 19. Place a heart on the number that is between 31 and 33.*

*Extension: Students use the picture (i.e. I love) as a writing prompt.*
